UK PARLIAMENTARIANS VISITS UMATI

Earlier this year, UMATI hosted delegates from the UK Parliament who aimed to review the progress of sexual and reproductive health programs funded by the UK government and implemented by local partners such as UMATI Tanzania - IPPF's Member Association in the country.

The delegation comprise of five lawmakers from the UK House of Commons and House of Lords representing the All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on Population, Development and Reproductive Health. During their visit to UMATI, they met representatives with from UMATI and the International Planned Parenthood Federation, to learn about the youth center that has been providing sexual health resources and services to both in-school and out-ofschool youth since 1983.





Back in the years when a girl was found she pregnant was immediately expelled from school. This procedure had been discriminating young women for years, worsening their life and depriving their educational opportunities. After seeing that, UMATI through the Youth Centre established empowerment activities like cookery, tailoring and baking to help teenage mothers in Income-generating engage help sustain their activities to needs.











YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

UMATI's youth programs continue to thrive, with several youth-led activities and workshops held across various regions. These initiatives are designed to foster leadership skills and SRHR awareness among young people, encouraging them to become SRH advocates for positive change in their communities.

Side activities conducted during the symposium included HIV and STI testing, Hepatitis B testing, diabetes screening, cervical and breast cancer screening, as well as counseling on reproductive health and family planning, benefiting more than 300 youth. UMATI was able to provide youth education to more than 86278 youths in the first half of 2024

INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING



We recently concluded a transformative workshop on gender in Dar Es Salaam. A gender training manual was developed and shared with the aim of capacitating Trainers of Trainers (TOTs) from TVET institutions with knowledge on gender mainstreaming into their respective plans, policies, and programs.

UMATI organized training а comprehensive Post Abortion Care (cPAC) and the District Health Information System -Tanzania Health Management Information Systems (DHIS 2-HMIS). The training aimed to equip participants with knowledge DHIS2&HIMS systems utilizina on improve cPAC data capturing into HMIS for analysis and decision-making. health management information system focal persons and five members of the Coalition to Address Maternal Morbidity and Mortality due to Abortion Complications (CAMMAC) received the training.
